Counting: Apples and Apple Seeds



Objective:

To use one-to-one correspondence to count apples and apple seeds.

Kindergarten Standards:

- W.K.2 I can share information that I have learned using a combination of pictures, talk, and writing
- K.CC.3 I can write numbers from 0 to 20. I can count how many objects I have and write the number to match what I have counted
- K.CC.4a I can count objects using the correct number names

Materials:

- Bag of Appplewood[™] Fresh + The Produce Moms[®] Apples
- Apple Stickers
- Attached Worksheet
- Knife or Apple Slicer

Lesson:

- After watching the virtual field trip, show the bag of Applewood Fresh + The Produce Moms Apples to the kids.
- Have them predict how many apples they think are in the bag.
- Then, practice counting by having the whole class count out loud as the teacher pulls the apples out of the bag. Discuss whose predictions were close.
- Using the worksheet, the kids can use apple stickers to place the same number of apples on the tree. In the circle, they can write the total number on the line.
- When done, the teacher can cut the apples and remove the seeds.
- Put the kids in small groups, and provide each group with some seeds.
- Have them predict how many seeds there are. Then have them count and present their number to the class.
